### California by the Numbers

#### Aviation:

- Total annual economic impact of Commercial Service Airports on the State of California (including employment, payroll, output):
   \$175.7 billion (4.2% of U.S. GDP)
- Commercial Service Airports employment:
  1.1 million jobs, \$48.4 billion in payroll (4.8% of U.S. jobs)
- General Aviation annual economic impact:
  \$30.2 billion, highest general aviation impact in the U.S.
- 22 Federal Airfield & 1 Joint Use with
  653 State-Permitted Aviation Facilities (consisting of 350 heliports—170 hospital and 180 corporate/police/fire/ag); 241 public use airports (214 general aviation and 27 commercial passenger service); and 62 special use airports
- → 25,901 FAA registered aircraft in the state (as of Dec. 2019)
- → 61,786 FAA certified pilots (as of Dec. 2019)
- → 11,034 Remote Pilots; and 9,674 Flight Instructors (as of Dec. 2019)
- → A record 241 million passengers passed through the state's commercial service airports (2018), an increase of 5%
- An average 5.0 million U. S. Short Tons of high-valued air cargo passes through the state's airports each year
- Aviation user taxes generate \$350 million in revenue each year, but less than 2% is returned to support the state's Aeronautics Program

#### Aerospace:

- → California is home to 32 military bases across all services
- → As a global Aerospace leader, the Aerospace and Defense Industry in California supports a workforce of 354,010 jobs and produces a total economic output of \$123,805 million (2017)
- California has the second highest U.S. Aerospace and Defense Employment in the U.S. with 437,900 jobs supported.
- → California has the second highest U.S. Aerospace and Defense Sales at \$92.7 billion.
- California is forecast to be the top state in the nation in production of unmanned aircraft systems, with more than

**12,000 jobs and over \$14 billion** in economic impact in the first decade

- California has 3 NASA Centers:
